

<sup>4</sup> The LORD works out everything to its proper end - even the wicked for a day of disaster.


<sup>5</sup> The LORD detests all the proud of heart. Be sure of this: They will not go unpunished.

#### **General Data Protection Regulation**

Under this new legislation the Church needs your permission to have your name and other data on the lists it keeps.

Perhaps the most important list is the Church Electoral Roll. You will have filled in a form and entered certain data and signed the form to be on this list, that could have been as long ago as 2013. (Next year 2019, we have to renew the roll.) There are other lists: Gift Aid donors, Church Officers and committees, People who receive Emailed Upper Alde Links or other information documents.

We would like to include all these lists on one Data Consent Form. If you receive one of these forms it is because we think you are on a list, please complete it, sign and return it as soon as possible.

The Act officially came into force on 25th May 2018.

#### **Interviews**

By the time you read this, two candidates will have been interviewed for the vacancy of Priest in Charge of our Benefice. You may have heard the interviews took place on the 23rd & 24th July.
