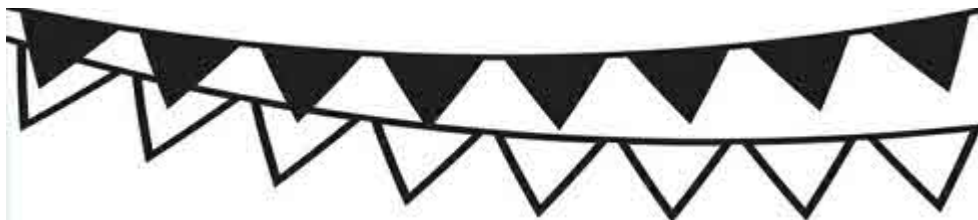

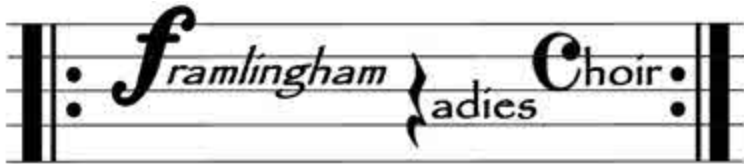

Annual Parish Meeting - 21st April at the Village Hall

Parish Council: Sonia Frost, chairman of the Parish Council, reported on the wide range of topics covered at their monthly meetings – from support of the Village Hall to planning applications. At the time of the meeting, there were 4 vacancies on the Parish Council. Tim and Rob have continued to improve the Pocket Park and, following a £8k award from Tesco, a castle climbing frame was installed. Volunteers are still needed for the Emergency Plan which would come into action, for example, if there was a flood, heavy snow or blocked roads. Highways – the signage at Stone Corner has finally been replaced but requests for double yellow lines outside the pub and new signage near New Lea, while agreed in principal by the council, would need to be funded by the PC. Badingham has registered for the Beacons of Light event on 11.11.18, when a national chain of beacons will be lit to commemorate the ending of WWI.

District Councillor: Carol Poulter explained how the merger of Suffolk Coastal and Waveney District Councils are making savings which can be passed on to residents. Carol sits on the Sizewell C Consultation committee and briefly touched on infrastructure concerns. Each District Councillor has funds available for special projects. Carol was pleased to have given her entire Community Award for 2016 to Badingham Shop and Café which she described as ‘delightful’.

Pocket Park: Balancing the needs of wildlife and families, Rob Welham said the Pocket Park has had a fantastic year. He was pleased to say the play area is in regular use after grant money had funded new play equipment. More work is planned for the pond.

Badingham Community Council: The Village Fete was another great success, reported Pauline Skevington, despite the unsettled weather. Many had enjoyed the buffet in the evening to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday but the chill prevented many lingering to listen to the band. Thanks were given to Lisa and Mark for hosting the events and providing the catering. Among other donations and gifts, the BCC have funded a mower for the ‘dedicated gang’ who ensure the churchyard is a tidy and peaceful place to visit.

Enterprise Badingham: Tanya Newton's report said the group maintains their dedication to pursue all requests to enhance the community. Edward Meigh, heavily involved with Enterprise Badingham from the outset, will be dearly missed. Tanya expressed her thanks for the generosity of Caroline and James Holloway in allowing use of their building for the Shop and Café and the District Councillor's funding award, which had brought both pride and publicity. 31 volunteers are involved and locals, visitors and tourists and welcomed; creating a good meeting place and enhancing community spirit. Money raised by the shop has gone towards equipping the church with new toilet facilities and providing two new colonies of bees for the Bee Group. The possibility of a forest school on the Pocket Park, as a new home for the Playschool,

had been explored. Future plans include a garden beside the shop, monthly litter picks and a programme of workshops.

Maypole: Celebrating 24 years, Maypole welcomes 29 regular members to their varied diary of monthly meetings. These include a quiz, interesting speakers, treasure hunt, BBQ and Christmas meal. This year the ladies are raising money for the RNLI.

Badingham Church: Following the Rector's retirement on 30th April, the church will be in the safe hands of church wardens Victor Warne and Robert Foster. There were a number of special services throughout the year and enjoyable events included the Queen's 90th Birthday Beacon, a Beetle Drive, Harvest BBQ and a pilgrimage to Lincoln. The White Horse was packed for carol singing and it was lovely to hear the village handbells rung again. A new initiative is Gather Together, to meet before the monthly family service to share breakfast.

Thanks were given to the band of workers who keep the church and churchyard neat and tidy with special thanks to Merlin, Bob, Victor and Rita who had devised and fitted the new disabled toilet. In other news, the church bells have been serviced, the bell tower cleaned and LED lights fitted to the Christmas cross. In November, an altar candlestick and small desk had been stolen after a break-in.

Neighbourhood Watch: Sonja started her report by thanking Gerald Tedder for his many years support as a coordinator. There had been 24 reports of crime and suspicious behaviour over the year, including four burglaries and a number of accidents on the A1120. Parking outside the White Horse and dog-fouling remain the biggest headaches but there was also concern about hare coursing and rogue traders.

There are 228 properties in the village (including 9 holiday homes), with 21 changes of occupant in the past year. Sonja provides a welcome pack to all new residents, please let her know if you haven't received yours. Currently, a coordinator is needed for Bowling Green Road, if you would like to be more involved. Sonja urged everyone to be alert and watchful to prevent crime in our neighbourhood.

Gardening Club: Meg described how the club meets once a month to share their mutual interest in gardening over coffee and cake. Last year they had an outing to Green Island Gardens, near Ardleigh, and hope to have at least one outing this year.

Quiz Nights: A tried and tested formula makes the monthly quiz a great success. Ian thanked the quizmasters for their support and Mark and Lisa for hosting. The Quiz runs between the months of October and July and last year raised £700 for various charities and local organisations. That amount is likely to increase with more people taking part in recent months, raising between £80 and £90 per night at just £2 a head to join in.

Everyone then stayed on for a good natter over cheese and biscuits, bubbly and cake in celebration of the Queen's birthday.

It is restricted to only people who can verify they are Badingham residents. Other users can choose to respond and offer help. You will need a computer and/or a Smartphone to use Nextdoor.

A few of us decided it would be a good idea to use Nextdoor in our village. To start the ball rolling many of you will have received a postcard through your door inviting you to join. And lots of you have signed up, more than 75 at the time of writing. Thank you. It is, of course, entirely optional. But if you threw away your invitation and have since decided you would like to join after all, then please e-mail me at the address at the end and I will send you an invitation to join.

We would like Nextdoor Badingham to be a useful facility where everyone can enjoy using it in a safe and respectful manner, so I urge you to follow the Nextdoor community guidelines: be helpful, not hurtful; don't use Nextdoor as your personal soapbox; promote local businesses the right way; use your true identity; keep it clean and legal. More information about these guidelines is on the Nextdoor website.

You may notice sometimes a post or message from one of our neighbouring villages. You can choose to post either to Badingham, in which case only Badingham users can see and respond to it, or you can post to all the neighbouring villages as well. You may choose to do this if you want to ask recommendations from a wider area. The choice is yours. So where you may see a message from someone in Bruisyard it is because the person has opted to post to all the neighbouring villages.

Nextdoor was formerly called Streetlife, which some of you may have heard about. If you were a Streetlife user and have now started using Nextdoor you should be aware of some privacy differences. I encourage you to look at the online help where it explains the differences.

Neighbourhood Watch is a volunteer organisation set up to assist the residents of this parish and the Suffolk Constabulary; it acts as a go-between. Suffolk is one of the lowest crime areas in the UK.

The main aim of the Neighbourhood Watch is to ensure that it remains so. If you are new to Badingham, please give me a call to sign up and I will put you in touch with your local coordinator.

I've been reading an interesting article about Police Call, a long-running feature on Anglia TV. I can remember it starting back in January 1963; I've always been interested in the work of the Police. The object of Police Call was to involve the public, with a great deal of cooperation between police forces and members of the public who gave vital information in unsolved crimes. It became one of About Anglia's longest running regular features. Dick Joice was the first presenter, until numerous anonymous threatening letters began to arrive, so he stepped down and the Police were invited to front it themselves. Things certainly have come a long way since, but the Police still rely on our help in tackling crime.

BADINGHAM

A letter box fixed on a fence was broken into and two envelopes removed. Please everyone be very careful with outside letterboxes.

DEBIT CARD FRAUD

Police have released CCTV images of a woman they would like to speak to in connection with the theft of £12,500 from a bank account. A woman went to one branch of a bank to request a new debit card and then to another to request a new pin code. Both were sent to the cardholders address and intercepted, without her knowledge. The card and PIN were used at branches of the bank in Ipswich, Bury St Edmunds and Newmarket. The customer has been compensated by the bank.

Police are keen to speak to the woman described as white, of slim build, in her 50s or 60s with shoulder length brown hair. Anyone who may recognise her is asked to call Bury St Edmunds CID by dialling Suffolk Police on 101, quoting crime no. 69501/16.

BREAK-IN LAXFIELD

A home in Fressingfield Road, Laxfield was broken into between 16 - 18 April. A window was forced to gain entry and, after an untidy search throughout the house, a number of pieces of jewellery and cash were stolen.

If you were out that way, or have heard anything, give Suffolk Police a call on 101 quoting crime no. 37/29634/17.

GUIDE DOGS

Police are urging people to report attacks on Guide Dogs after the creation of a new offence under the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014. This came in after a Guide Dog was attacked, if you remember, 2 years ago and will be investigated if a report is made. Phone Police HQ at Martlesham on 101.

MOTORIST JAILED

A motorist who spent five years dodging a speeding fine was jailed for perjury and perverting the course of justice. He had ignored Police attempts to confirm who was driving the car before making up stories to shift the blame. He was also fined £60 - he should have had to pay more!

SCAMMERS

Be suspicious if they:

- * Make contact out of the blue and ask you for personal or financial details
- * Put you under pressure to respond quickly
- * Ask you to keep their offer a secret
- * Make promises that sound too good to be true

What you should do:

- * Verify their Identity
- * Look out for grammatical or spelling mistakes
- * Never give out your Bank Details
- * Never send money to someone you don't know
- * Say NO to persuasive sales talk

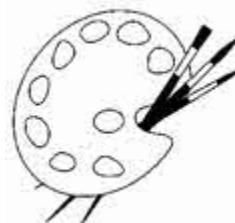

News from Dennington School



Chaffinches Class

Our theme for Summer Term is Pirates and the Seaside – we have made a pirate ship which will provide the children with many opportunities to use imaginative language within their role play. During Textiles, we will be learning how to sew and we will use our new skills to make a lighthouse. We have started our Summer mathematical learning by looking at time and the language used when discussing time. This term's Science topic is learning all about the structure of a plant and we will be able to name and identify common plants and trees.

Wrens Class

Our Summer theme is Help our Habitats. We will open our topic by writing stories from the perspective of an animal; exploring how they think and feel in different situations. We will be exploring which living things live in different habitats, making detailed sketches of animals and finding out how environmental changes affect the animals living there. We will also be thinking about how we can have a positive effect on our environment.

History will be closely linked to Geography and how land use has changed over time. In Maths we will focus on geometry, measurement and statistics. The weekly times tables test have been a great success in motivating the class, so these will continue this term.

Robins Class

What an exciting morning we had after reading the story Pirates Love Underpants. The pirates invaded our classroom and stole the chest of magic shells. The children then wrote a newspaper article about our invasion.

The children had great fun at the didgeridoo workshop; all learning how to play it along with learning facts about Australia. The children have enjoyed their DT project based on the Australian topic. They followed a recipe to make a lamington cake. They designed it, made it and decorated it.

The children had a great time visiting the lambs at Framlingham Hall. The children learnt about where their food comes from and how the lambs are looked after when they are orphaned.

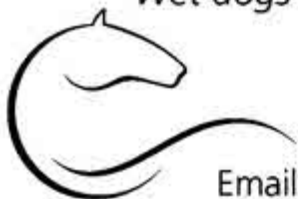
