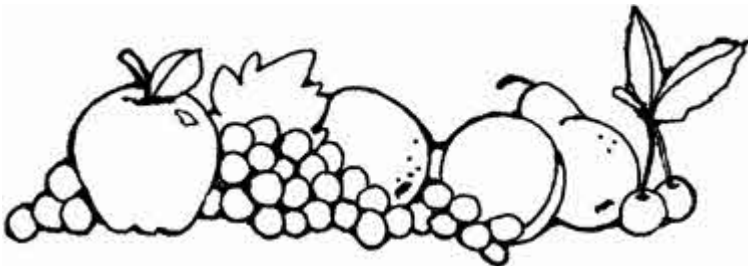

## **PROBLEM STREET PARKING AT THE WHITE HORSE PUB**

The Parish Council has done all that they can to put pressure on the Police and Suffolk County Council Highways Dept. regarding the dangerous parking up to the junction on Low Street outside the Pub.

The Parish Council arranged and met with Suffolk County Council Highways for a site meeting. The Parish Council has no powers to do works on the Highway, the only authority that is able to is Suffolk County Council. Following the meeting, Suffolk County Council confirmed that they could not introduce double yellow lines as they have no funds to do so. This is the result of cuts to their budgets in line with central government austerity measures.

Suffolk County Council suggested that if Badingham Parish Council or village fundraising provided the £10,000 required for the exercise, they could look to install yellow lines. The Parish Council does not have this amount of money and is therefore not in the position to fund the works, which can only be carried out by Suffolk County Council Highways.

## Local Plan Review

### Issues and Options Consultation

#### **Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended)**

Suffolk Coastal District Council is committed to undertaking a review of its Local Plan as outlined in the adopted Core Strategy. The Core Strategy sets the broad scale and distribution of growth across the district up to 2027.

The Council is now undertaking a Local Plan Review which is to begin with the Issues and Options document which is published for public consultation **until Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October 2017 (23:45)**.

#### **Key Message from Councillor Tony Fryatt, Cabinet Member with responsibility for Planning:**

*Across the country, there is a serious shortage of decent, affordable housing and the average cost of housing is rising all the time. It is important that delivery of housing across this district matches the need of communities by building more homes that people want to live in, in places people want to live. To help communities, a Local Plan needs to provide housing opportunities for younger people, families and older people as well as encouraging a range of employment opportunities alongside the delivery of infrastructure at the right time.*

*A Local Plan can help deliver the vision for each community across the district by setting out the level of growth which needs to be planned for and identifies where that growth should go. This consultation is the first stage in the process and the first opportunity for members of the public, partners and interested parties to have their say.*

*As we move forward with the Local Plan, Suffolk Coastal will be working closely with our neighbouring authorities, Babergh, Ipswich and Mid Suffolk, to identify the most sustainable locations for future growth and development as well as balancing the need for infrastructure and economic growth.*

*The Issues and Options consultation document:*

*Y considers the need for further growth in the area and where it should take place*

• poses questions on a variety of topics such as Community Facilities, Heritage, Tourism and Landscape

- includes a large number of sites which have been put forward to the Council as “potential land for development” including housing, employment and other uses

*These sites have been submitted by landowners, developers and other interested stakeholders*

*At this early stage all the sites received have been published as part of this consultation, regardless of known constraints, for transparency and openness*

• *Far more sites have been put forward than we actually need*

• *These sites currently have no formal planning status*

• *We will thoroughly assess all sites and reduce the number down as the Local Plan progresses through future rounds of public consultation*

*Public consultation and engagement is an important part of the Local Plan process and throughout the consultation period a series of drop in sessions have been arranged. These drop in sessions are open to anybody who wishes to find out more about the consultation and are being held in the following venue on the date listed below:*

This is not the action of the present Parish Council, they will respond to have this entry withdrawn, it is Section 106 land which has a preservation legal status to provide open green space.

Within the consultation are the options of where the growth of housing should be concentrated such as the A14 corridor, A12 corridor or continue spreading it across the rural villages and towns. Also, to give opinion on the above parcels of land and the potential houses they would deliver.

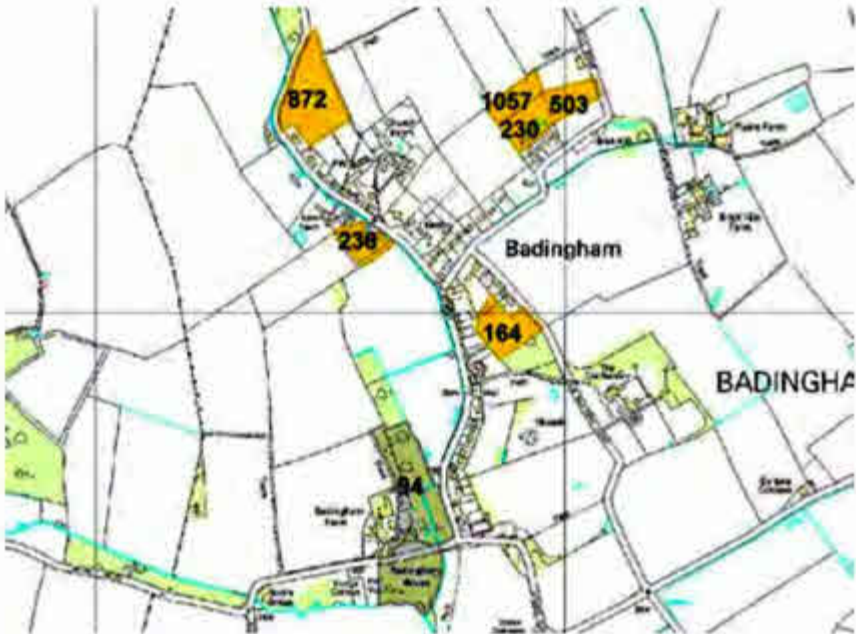

## **MOTORIST ROBBED**

At 5:10am on Monday 11 September a man in his 30s was robbed on the Metfield to Fressingfield road after stopping to check on a Renault car which was blocking the road. He was punched and struck on the head before cash was stolen from his wallet. Crime reference: 60101/17

**NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH** builds a stronger community spirit. By getting to know your neighbours, anyone suspicious will become much more obvious.

By working together we can continue to keep both Badingham and our County of Suffolk a safe place to live and work and enjoy our beautiful countryside.

## FROM SUFFOLK POLICE

Police are asking residents to remain vigilant following incidents of **Door Step Crime**. There have been six reports of Rogue Traders calling on residents and demanding cash to repair alleged electricity faults. The elderly and vulnerable are the people typically targeted. Please **DO NOT** let them in or entertain them at the door.

**1 in 3 Burglaries** are because homes are left unsecured. Suffolk Police are urging residents to keep windows and doors locked to prevent an easy target for thief. (Educate your children on this too, thanks). Of the 185 burglaries reported to Suffolk Police over April/May 2017, 65 were due to a lack of security.

The campaign to target **drink and drug driving** is still on-going. Officers from Norfolk and Suffolk Roads Policing Unit will breathalyse any driver stopped due to concerns over the manner of their driving, a vehicle defect or involved in a collision. During 2016, 113 motorists were caught drink and drug driving in Suffolk.

**HMRC scams** - Police are reminding residents to be alert to telephone scams. In one incident, an elderly person received a phone call saying the Tax Office was owed money. They were threatened with an arrest warrant unless £500 of iTunes vouchers were paid.

There are also many scam tax emails claiming people are entitled to a Tax Rebate with a link to login for more details – **DON'T CLICK**.

NOTE 1: HMRC never use texts to tell about tax rebates or penalty and will never ask for payment in this way.

NOTE 2: Telephone Numbers and Text Messages can easily be spoofed. You should never trust a number you see on your telephone display.

**Lead Thieves** – communities are asked to be alert following reports of attempted theft in recent weeks. There are concerns that some incidents are not being reported, which limits the Constabulary's ability to take action.

Rural churches, like Badingham, are often targeted due to their isolated location. Chief Inspector Stuart Grimsey said "We are asking people to take interest in their local church whilst they are out and about.
